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WHO WE ARE

Our program is based on high expectations, academic and character development, a focus on preparing all students for college and choice-filled lives, coaching and continuous learning for teachers and staff, and support for students to and through college and career. For 15 years in Massachusetts, we have developed and refined an educational model that improves outcomes for our kids and families. 
KIPP:MA is a Title I District that currently operates five schools in the Greater Boston area: KIPP Academy Lynn Collegiate, KIPP Academy Lynn Middle School, KIPP Academy Lynn Elementary, KIPP Academy Boston Middle School, and KIPP Academy Boston Elementary. We serve over 2,000 students in grades K-12 and employ over 300 staff members.

KIPP ACADEMY LYNN COLLEGIATE

As the second school in the KIPP:MA region, KIPP Academy Lynn Collegiate (KALC) opened in 2011 with a class of 96 9th graders. In 2015, that founding class became our first class to graduate from a KIPP high school in Massachusetts.

COLLEGE MATRICULATION

The graduation rate for KALC's Class of 2020 was 100%. In this class, 78% plan to matriculate to a four-year college or university and 10% plan to matriculate to a two-year college. They are projected to graduate college at more than 5X the graduation rate of educationally underserved students across the country.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

To receive a KALC diploma, students in the Class of 2021 must successfully complete a minimum of 24 credits (1 credit = 1 year) as well as meet the MA CORE and MCAS requirements. To graduate, students must complete the following:

GRADING SCALE

KALC grades on a numeric scale aligned with college letter grading systems. Refer to the chart below for each number grade, letter grade, and corresponding grade point values. Any grade of 69 or below is considered a failing grade and receives an F on the transcript. However, grades of 65-69 do receive grade point average credit, as indicated below. In calculating grade point averages, we award 1 additional point for Advanced Placement classes. Pass/Fail grades are not factored in to grade point averages.

CLASS OF 2021 CUMULATIVE UNWEIGHTED GPA DISTRIBUTION


Because of the small class size, KIPP Academy Lynn Collegiate does not rank students numerically. Deciles are based on unweighted cumulative GPA through junior year.

ACADEMIC COURSES

Students at KIPP Academy Lynn Collegiate attend class from 8:20am to 3:40pm*, with office hours taking place from 4:00pm to 5:00pm. Because of the length of the school day and the rigor of the curriculum, students are strongly advised not to take more than one AP class their sophomore year or more than three AP courses each their junior and senior years. KALC does not offer Honors or IB classes due to school size. Juniors and Seniors are automatically enrolled in the Junior and Senior Seminar courses, respectively, which focus on college and career readiness. KIPP Through College & Career staff will support our alumni to ensure students have the resources to persist past graduation.

*KALC is beginning the 20-21 school year virtually with synchronous class from 9:00am-2:00pm and asynchronous from 2:00pm-4:00pm.
