


New Research Shows That KIPP Public Schools Are Closing the College Completion Gap

A new Mathematica study released titled <u>"Long-Term Impacts of KIPP Middle and High Schools on College Enrollment, Persistence, and Attainment"</u> shows that the impact of attending a KIPP middle and high school. Outlined below are some key findings from the study.

- Students who attended both KIPP middle and high school were nearly twice as likely to persist and graduate from a four-year college than those who did not. This is the first independent study of KIPP Public Schools' long-term impact spanning 15 years.
- Students who attended KIPP for both middle school and high school were 67% more likely to enroll in a four-year college than those who did not go to KIPP.
- KIPP schools are closing the college completion gap. The impact of attending a KIPP middle
 and high school, extrapolated nationwide, would be large enough to close the degree
 completion gap for Black students and nearly close the degree completion gap for Latinx
 students in the United States.
